GOLF COURSE RULES

EVERYONE - MEMBERS, YOUTH, CHILDREN AND GUEST - MUST SIGN IN AT THE GOLF SHOP BEFORE TEEING OFF.

- ◆ All golf play shall be governed by the rules of the United States Golf Association except as modified by local rules.
- ◆ The course superintendent has complete authority to prohibit play or restrict use of golf cars at any time he deems necessary. In his absence the golf professional shall have the authority.
- ◆ Out-of-bounds is designated by white stakes, lateral hazards by red stakes, water hazards by yellow stakes, rough only. Green stakes from the south rear corner of clubhouse to the bottom of the 9th hole denote free drop in circle.
- ◆ All golf cars shall be kept 30 feet from greens, tees and traps. Observe all signs for golf car traffic.
- ◆ All players are reminded to replace divots, repair ball marks on the green, rake traps, place all trash in the receptacles provided (including cigarette butts, beverage containers and caps) and generally care for your course and clubhouse as you would your own home.
- ◆ Players coming off hole #9 must alternate teeing off #10 with those teeing off hole #1. Players must not start on the 3rd tee until after 4 pm on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays. At any time, players completing the 2nd hole have the right of way over players starting on the 3rd hole.
- ◆ Practice shots are limited to the 1st fairway practice area and to a time when no one is teeing off #1 or #10 or when no lessons are being given.
- ◆ The use of soft spikes/spikeless golf shoes is recommended by the Golf Course Superintendent but is not mandatory.
- ◆ No one is allowed in the pond for ANY reason.

GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

WHENEVER A PLAYING GROUP HAS AN OPEN HOLE AHEAD OF IT (NO PLAYERS PLAYING THE NEXT HOLE) AND THERE ARE PLAYERS WAITING BEHIND, THIS SLOWER GROUP MUST STEP ASIDE AND ALLOW THE FASTER PLAYERS TO PLAY THROUGH. THIS MAY HAPPEN AT A TEE, WHILE ON THE FAIRWAY OR ON A GREEN!

Players and spectators are expected to be silent and still while others are hitting a shot. This courtesy regarding noise should also be extended to all playing groups on the course.

All players - seasoned, new, youth - are expected to learn and observe golf rules and etiquette.

Beginning golfers are reminded that Saturday, Sunday and holiday mornings are busy times and they will probably have to let many faster groups through if playing at these times. They are encouraged to learn at less busy times.

GUEST FEES AND REGULATIONS

Guest greens fee for 18 holes is \$30.00 AND for 9 holes is \$15.00, payable in cash, Visa or Mastercard only. There are no charge accounts. Guests must be accompanied by a member on the course.

Guests may play only (5) five days in any calendar year, excluding play in tournaments and matches sponsored by the Tournament Committee. Golfing privileges are not included in a social membership.

Any organized group activity request must be presented in writing by a golf club member to the Board. More than two foursomes teeing off consecutively are considered an organized group.

Guest fees are waived on GUEST DAYS if both the member and guest participate in the event AND ATTEND DINNER. This includes Stag Days and Fish Frys.

Beverages consumed on the course must be purchased from the club. When the kitchen is open, food must be purchased from the club.

PLAYING TIMES

- ◆ Members are encouraged to play in foursomes on busy days. The Golf Shop Staff shall have the prerogative of forming foursomes when necessary. The staff will also arrange a foursome for you to play with on weekend or holiday mornings. If you do not have a game, call the golf shop the day before to be paired.
- ◆ Between Memorial Day and Labor Day, children under the age of 18 shall not be permitted to play before 12:30 pm on Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied on the Course by a member 18 years of age or older. Certified Junior Golfers may be exempt from this rule. Certification is done by the Junior Golf Committee by means of observation of play and passing a rules and etiquette test.
- ◆ In order to accommodate regularly scheduled events and league play, the Course is
- ◆ CLOSED to all except participants during the following times:

Women's 9 Hole League	Open to 10:30 am
Women's Twilight League	5:00 to Dark
Men's Twilight League	1:00 to Dark
Couples Golf League	5:00 to Dark
Junior Golf	Closed until 11:00 am

- ◆ The Emeritus League (Senior Men) play at 1:00 pm on Tuesdays unless otherwise noted on the club calendar. The 1st (10th) tee will be closed from 1 to 1:30 pm.
- ◆ Please check the schedule on the Golf Shop bulletin board for NEWLY SCHEDULED EVENTS.

ANY FLEXIBILITY IN THESE PLAYING TIMES IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE GOLF PROFESSIONAL.

CLUB HOUSE

- ◆ Smoking is NOT PERMITTED in the clubhouse.
- ◆ All cars of members, staff and guests are to be parked in the parking area, NOT adjacent to the tee or the clubhouse.
- ◆ Lockers may be rented for \$25.00 plus tax for the season.
- ◆ Restaurant and Bar - Hours of Operations, Tuesday through Sunday; closed Mondays except for Memorial Day and Labor Day.
 - Weekdays - 8 to 11 am - coffee and snacks; 11:30 - 3 pm - lunch & tavern menu. Bar 'Til Closing.
 - Weekends - 7 to 10 am - coffee, kitchen open to 3 pm. Bar 'Til Closing.
 - Holidays - 7 am to 3 pm. Bar 'Til Closing.
 - Dinner - when scheduled
 1. Check bulletin board for dates and menu.
 2. Twilight league and couples league members are expected to stay for dinner in their league.
 3. All club members may attend Friday fish frys or couples league dinners by making a reservation.
 4. On Friday nights when there is no couples league, members may bring guests on scheduled fish fry nights for golf and dinner and are not required to pay greens fees for their guests.
 - Special Events - mixed golf tournaments, dinner dances etc. - these events require a prepaid reservation made at least one week prior to the event. Refunds will be given up to two days prior to the event.
 - Coupons may be used for food or bar purchases. Coupons and membership lists are to be picked up from the restaurant staff at the beginning of the season.
- ◆ The illegal use of drugs or alcohol will NOT be tolerated. Therefore, NO MEMBERS, guests or employees, will be served alcoholic beverages by any employee or member if their ability appears to be impaired.
- ◆ Obscene language is prohibited at all times.
- ◆ The Dress Code for members (including juniors), guests and clubhouse employees is as follows:
 - LONG PANTS OR SHORTS OR SKIRTS - no blue jeans between Memorial Day/Labor Day
 - MEN - GOLF SHIRTS - no T shirts or muscle/tank tops.
 - WOMEN - BLOUSES OR SHIRTS-tank top not permitted-need either collar or sleeves.

GOLF SHOP

- ◆ The Golf Shop will be open daily at 7:30 am from April 5th to October 17th and weekends and holidays at 6:30 am.
- ◆ Golf lessons are available by appointment with professional, Dennis Colligan, individual lessons are \$45.00 per $\frac{3}{4}$ hour. A series of 5 lessons is \$200.00. With assistant professional, Ric Pettit, individual lessons are \$40.00 per $\frac{3}{4}$ hour. A series of 5 lessons is \$175.00.
- ◆ Club storage is available which includes club cleaning. The fee is \$50.00 per bag. Club storage ends on October 17th.
- ◆ Pro Shop winnings (credits) may not be applied to outstanding account balances, greens fees or golf car fees. Expirations date of credits is October 17th of the current year.
- ◆ The professional staff is here to help you have an enjoyable round of golf. Please ask for help with any aspect of the game needed.

GOLF CARS

- ◆ NO ONE UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE may operate a golf car unless he/she has a driver's license. TWO PERSONS is the maximum number allowed to ride on a club golf car.
- ◆ Golf cars must be signed for in the Golf Shop before using.
- ◆ Golf Car Rates - Tax Included:
